3 Chairman's Report:

4 Treasurer's Report:

In the absence of the treasurer, Richard Whiffin reported that the accounts had been audited and circulated prior to the meeting. He then read the Treasurer's report:

'I have pleasure in submitting the attached accounts. At the time of writing in mid-December, I am awaiting the Auditor's sign off and I will ensure that this certificate is available at the AGM.

One word of caution is necessary. In this financial year 2013-14 we have banked two Abbfest "thank you" payments of £500 each; one for 2013 and one for 2014. Thus, in looking at the accounts, this must be considered as it effectively understates the loss for the year by £500.

That said, to produce a loss of only £902 when we hosted the French (which cost a net £3136) is a remarkable achievement. The committee try hard to ensure that we make a reasonable profit on each event, as the aggregation of these helps pay for the bi-annual French visit to Abbotskerswell.

At year end 30 November 2014, we had cash and bank balances totalling £5128. The conventional wisdom is we need to have 7k in the bank by the time the French come (2016) so we will be organising a fund raising event in November 2015.

Your committee does all that it can to put on a balanced set of events, taking into account all interests. But if you do have any particular ideas, then do tell us please!
